

## Instructions to Authors

The manuscript (two printed copies) should be sent to the Local Organizing Committee by the identical file on the CD-ROM, diskette or by e-mail. The manuscript should be sent to the following address:

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All papers must be written in English. If English is not the authors' first language, the manuscript should be given to a native speaker of English for proofreading.

The paper should be divided into the following sections: **Abstract, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions, Acknowledgements, and References.**

The original should contain all figures, illustrations and diagrams (**black and white**), on maximum six pages of A4 format (210 x 297 mm), margins: 25 mm in all sides. Please prepare the manuscript using the Microsoft Word compatible formats. All text should be typed in 10 pt Arial with single line spacing and justified.

**The title** should be typed in 12 pt, bold letters and centred. The authors' name should be typed in 12 pt, normal and centred, followed by affiliations (12 pt, italic and centred). The manuscript must contain the business address of all authors with asterisk next to the name of the corresponding author. Footnote at the bottom of the first page should contain information about the corresponding author (phone, fax and e-mail).

**The abstract** (not longer than one single-spaced typewritten page) should explain the aim of the paper and include the most relevant results and conclusions. No abbreviations or references should appear in the abstract. Directly below the abstract, authors should provide key words (max. 5 words).

**Tables and diagrams** should be constructed so as to be completely intelligible without reference to the text. The same data should not be reproduced in both diagrams and tables. Whenever possible formulae and equations are to be written in one line and numbered in square brackets [1]. Where necessary, the list of the symbols used, with corresponding values and units, should be enclosed on a separate sheet. All special characters (e.g. Greek letters) which may be confusing should be explained separately.

**SI** (System International) units should be used. Only symbols (not their subscripts, superscripts or description in brackets) of physical quantities should be written in italic.

**Nomenclature** of inorganic compounds should conform to the rules of the International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry.

**References** should be selective rather than extensive. They should be numerated in the order they are cited in the text. References should be numbered in parenthesis e.g. (1). The list of references should be included at the end of the text. If the original literature cited has not been available, the

authors should quote the source used. All references should be cited as recommended by IUPAC/IUB, as in the examples below.
